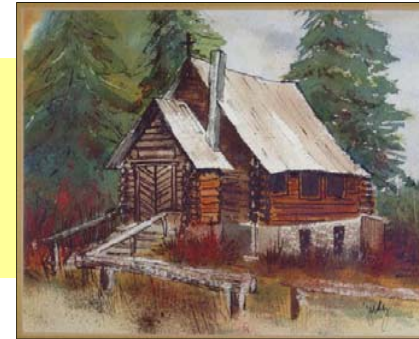

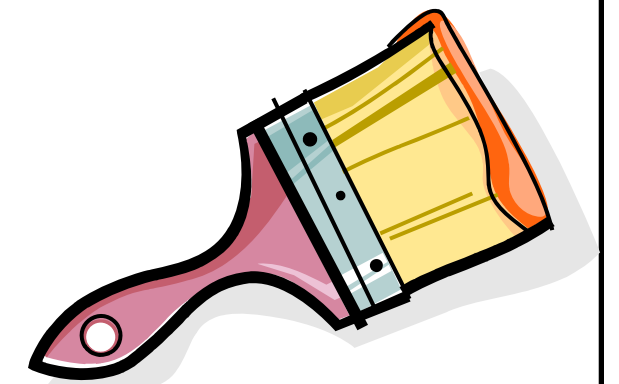

An update on the trip to Tanzania.....

At the St Andrews service on Sunday, May 16th, we asked your prayers for Patti and Phil and Leanne for a safe trip to Tanzania, an outreach to Msalato and Bishop Stanway that would be blessed, and a safe return home.



Well, as of Monday night they were all safe! Patti and Phil left for Tanzania Sunday, May 16<sup>th</sup>. Unfortunately, their flight from Detroit to Amsterdam had to return to the USA due to the ash from the Icelandic volcano. As of Monday evening they were stuck in Chicago trying to arrange their flights. Their itinerary and events scheduled at Msalato and Bishop Stanway are 'up in the air', These included a dinner in their honor with the Msalato students which the funds from the Foundation are supporting as well as a dinner with the Bishop of the Diocese of Central Tanganyika. As Patti has said, 'The best laid plans...'.  
Leanne was scheduled to fly from Jackson on Tuesday, May 18<sup>th</sup> on the same route that Patti and Phil were to take. Unfortunately her flight from Jackson was cancelled due to a mechanical problem, so she missed her flight! She returned to Pinedale and flew successfully on Saturday arriving in Tanzania on Monday

Well, all three are now on their trip. Patti and Phil were unable to get a flight to Tanzania until Friday, May 21<sup>st</sup>. Leanne was able to rebook her flight to Tanzania for a successful flight on Saturday, May 22<sup>nd</sup>. They have now joined forces and are seeing some of Tanzania's treasures before their time in Dodoma with Msalato and Bishop Stanway students. They will return to Pinedale on June 10<sup>th</sup>.
