- Honey Peanut Squares:** by Ann Stevens
4 C honey roasted peanuts, divided (I use plain peanuts)
1 Can (14 oz) sweetened condensed milk
1 Pkg (10 1/2 oz) miniature marshmallows
1 Pkg (10 Oz) peanut butter chips
1/2 C butter or margarine
1/2 C peanut butter

Line a 9x13x2 : pan with foil and coat with nonstick cooking spray. Sprinkle 2C peanuts in pan. In large saucepan, combine the milk, marshmallows, peanut butter chips, and peanut butter. Cook and stir until smooth. Pour over peanuts, spread evenly. Sprinkle with remaining peanuts, press down. Cover and refrigerate at least 45 min. Lift foil out of pan, cut into squares. Sort in an airtight container. Yield: about 4 doz.

Health Ministry Committee Meeting
May 1, 2005

Members Present: Wes Shields, Marilyn Huffman, Irene Wherritt, Sue Holz, Norm Pape, and Fran Milde (Chair)

Meeting called to order. Opening prayer offered by Wes.

Youth endeavors: The committee reconfirmed the idea of having a Kid's Corner on health in each newsletter. In addition, the focus for programs with the Wednesday School Program, Middle School Program, and High School Program will on life long health and fitness and relationship of health to God. These endeavors will be coordinated with Katie McClure and Wes Shields. Sue Holz and Fran Milde will work with the youth on the health committee to develop plans for incorporation. Report to be given at next meeting.

Outreach: Idea of working with Hospice explored. Report from Wes that at present 12-15 people are attending meetings. It was decided not to explore this further. The decision after discussion was to work with outreach committee in future but not to pursue any active program at this time. Ideas were: weight support, smoking, or grief support group.

Health Day: After discussion decision was that focus would be on caring for our bodies within a spiritual context. The committee wants this day to be fun such as having booths, a meal, and activities with in a party atmosphere. Will explore second Sunday in September (11th) as date for health day.

Task before next meeting:

Healing Service: Discussion was to make this service a part of health day to introduce service to congregation. Then to make this a part of Wednesday service twice a month. Wes will take to Worship committee for further discussion and planning.

Vestry Meeting

May 9, 2005

Present: Wes Shields, Cheryl Essington, Gail Randall, Gail Grubb, Juli James, Sarah Hixson, Fred Petersen and Shane Costello.

The meeting was called to order and Father Wes opened with a prayer.

Minutes of the last meeting: Gail Grubb moved to accept the minutes of the last meeting, Sarah seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously passed.

Treasurer's Report: April giving slowed down slightly, and this month there were some Rectory expenses that have yet to be reimbursed. Fred noted that the income still looks healthy. Sarah made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report, Juli seconded the motion and it was unanimously passed.

Senior Warden: Gail Randall has spoken with the County Assessor to let them know that we still own the Rectory although it is now being rented. Gail also noted that she is pleased that the committees are meeting and working.

Rector's Report: Father Wes extended a thank you to Gail and Sarah for getting the Outreach going, and also to acknowledge the work Shane and Fran have done in getting the Christian Ed organized. He noted that they have been putting lots of energy, work and commitment into it. Fran will be focusing on the adult portion and Shane will be focusing on the youth portion. Father Wes also wanted to clarify that Katie was hired as the youth director, not over the Wednesday school program, but to work with and oversee the middle school and high school group. Wes is pleased with the participation in the centering prayer group and would like to see more energy to keep the

support going.

Outreach: The outreach group has been meeting and is looking for something more involved than previous outreach projects. They would like to see something that the church community can embrace. Some of the suggested ideas were a safe house, somewhere where recovering addicts can go, and ways that we might provide opportunity for them to do something healthy, such as movie nights, and make our church a place of hope. Also suggested were ideas on how to minister to the k-8 kids, something similar to Big Brothers and Big Sisters, etc.

Christian Ed: Shane added that he had no real experience with Christian education and was excited to get information from the congregation on things they would like to see and what they would like to get out of our programs.

Master List: For May there is the annual clean up that hasn't been mentioned or scheduled yet. The vacuums that Randy ordered have been back-ordered and should be arriving any day. Fred noted that the bleeder line really needs to be moved to May, that April is usually too early.

Old Business:

1. Committee functions and meetings are going well, Wes is pleased.
2. Michelle Costello and Gail Randall are the delegates to the Diocesan Convention, with Betty Golden and Cheryl Essington as alternates. Gail Grubb has spoken to Barb Pape who has agreed to participate and guide the Audit Committee

New Business:

Honduras Trip- The Vestry received a written application from Betty Golden for assistance to participate in the Diocesan mission trip to Honduras. Since this is the first time the issue has come up, the vestry created the following guidelines:

St. Andrew's Vestry Guidelines for Supporting Diocesan Mission trip to Honduras:

1. All the requests for support shall be made in writing to the Vestry no later than February 1st in the year of the trip.
2. The Vestry shall support up to two people per year. Individuals who receive support may not re-apply for a period of five years. Preference will be given to the first applications received and to those who have not been before. Funding will be at the discretion of the Vestry, but shall not exceed \$1,000.00 in matching funds per individual.

Gail Grubb made a motion to accept the guidelines as above mentioned, Shane seconded the motion and the motion was unanimously passed. Shane made the motion to offer Betty Golden \$1,000.00; Sarah seconded the motion and the motion unanimously passed. Wes will talk to Betty about the trip.

Christian Ed. Survey- Shane asked the Vestry to review the Christian Ed survey to help guide his and Fran's vision. These will be handed out for the next few weeks, and will be also in the newsletter.

Summer service Times- The summer service time survey results showed that 50% more people preferred 9 am verses 8:30 am service. The Worship Committee will make this ultimate decision.

Recognition Sunday- Recognition Sunday will be May 22nd. This is a way to acknowledge everyone who has volunteered her time and energy to keeping our church clean and offering services such as the nursery.
