GETTING TO KNOW: MADELEINE SCANLON MURDOCK



When I arrived in Pinedale in 1966, Alice Harrower was one of the first to greet me. She concluded our conversation with, "We will see you in St Andrew's on Sunday." She was surprised (horrified?) when I told her I'd be attending Our Lady of Peace. "How does a good Scot come to attend the Catholic Church?" she asked with ill-disguised asperity. I explained that my Irish Catholic mother had determined that all four of her children would be raised R.C. When I was born, she enrolled me in the only Catholic Academy in three counties, and ten years later there was finally an opening for me. I graduated high school and college in Dundee, Scotland, worked for a design firm there, taught school for two years as an Art specialist, then decided life was passing me by and started travelling. Half a world later, I landed in Pinedale.

When Stan Murdock proposed, his Congregational Church had recently lost their minister and the Catholic priest was on extended sick leave. Together we decided we could find no one better than the Rev. Calvin Elliot to perform our wedding ceremony in 1973. We then regularly attended the Episcopal Church and five years later, Calvin baptized our only son, Scott, so

Alice's expectation that a "good Scot" should attend St. Andrew's was fulfilled. I find it difficult to believe that I have been a member for over 50 years, but that's how the math works!

This church has been a very important part of my life as a source of spiritual comfort, learning and companionship. I enjoy singing in the choir - "He who sings, prays twice." I have taught middle school and high school youth group and taken participants to EYC, taught Stephen Ministry courses, served as a worship leader and been Senior Warden thrice, and served as a delegate to Convention. Two current leaders who inspire me are the Bishop Michael Curry and John Philip Newell, and two from the past are St. Teresa of Avila and our own St. Andrew.

My hobbies include gardening, a challenge in this climate, reading, mostly fiction, although my favorite book is "The Lost World of the Kalahari". Favorite authors include Alan Garner, Jack Whyte, Stephen Lawhead, Neil Gaiman, and Isaac Azimov. I enjoy the Arts; theatre, music and painting, especially using water colors. Discovering cultural similarities and differences through travels in the Western Hemisphere has been stimulating and I would like to explore Tibet and Indochina.

I don't have a favorite Bible verse, but my favorite hymn is, "Be Thou My Vision" followed by "St. Patrick's Breastplate." Food for thought - "One person talking to an invisible being is considered crazy, 1,000 people is a cult, 10,000 is a religion." There are 2 million Episcopalians, part of the 85 million members of the worldwide Anglican communion. To me, it is important to be part of a group that proclaims Jesus' message of inclusivity, "for ALL nations."

ALTAR GUILD TRAINING: The Altar Guild is a wonderful, behind the scenes ministry. Mary Caucutt is very happy to help us expand and improve this important ministry. We could really use a few more helpers!

FOUNDATION FOR THE DIOCESE OF WYOMING GRANT FOR MENTAL HEALTH: In

January, the Vestry voted to apply to the Foundation for a continuation of funding for mental health in Sublette County, in collaboration with St. Hubert the Hunter (Bondurant) and St. John the Baptist (Big Piney.) We've had these funds available to anyone in the county who needs financial assistance with mental health counseling, since 2023. Our original grant of \$50,000 has been used by 107 community members for 521 sessions with mental health professionals from our county and beyond. We received very positive feedback from those providers, who felt that having these funds available made a huge difference in their clients' lives. Our new grant, which we will have May 31, is for \$40,000. The Foundation is looking for us to provide a bit of support in the form of a fundraiser or donations; an indication of our commitment to the project.

ECW PIE SALE CANCELLED THIS YEAR: Sukey and Joni have talked about this at length, and want to let everyone at St. Andrew's know that we are not going to do the pie sale this year. This summer, we have a lot

on our plates, including discernment for our rector search, scheduling visiting clergy, remodeling the rectory, leading Sunday worship, and taking care of each another - and self-care, too. There is a lot that goes into organizing and doing the work of the pie sale, and we believe it will be a year to give ourselves permission to let this go. We have provided funding for many worthwhile causes in the past, including Thistle Farms, SAFV, the Food Basket, Karimu and our own Suryapita at Our Little Roses Orphanage in Honduras. We need to continue to care for Suryapita until she is out of school; she is going to be 17 this year. Stay tuned for news of a No-bake Bake Sale to provide our annual \$750 for her. It's a no-calorie and sugar-free option! At our May Vestry meeting, we came up with the idea to have lemonade, coffee, and a shady spot to enjoy the Rendezvous Parade outside, and to invite anyone to come into the church for some quiet reflection time. Erin suggested that we could have the booklet with the history of St. Andrew's for folks who'd like to know about the more recent history of Pinedale, beyond the mountain-man days, and publicize our worship schedule.

St. Andrew's in the Pines Vestry Minutes April 14, 2025

- 1. Opening Prayer
- 2. Call to order at 5:40 pm: Present: Sukey Hohl, Senior Warden, Sarah Hixson, Junior Warden, Joni Mack, Treasurer, Julie Belton, Clerk, Sandy Cenac, Erin Hastey and guest Jessica Reynolds via Zoom.
- 3. The Transition Process. Jessica Reynolds, Diocesan Transitions Officer, gave us a summation of the steps we will take to discern our way to a new rector. A rector would probably be our best fit though we may consider having an interim or priest-in charge temporarily. There was a long discussion of whether we could put together a search committee. It was decided that we are currently too small in number, and the Vestry will serve as a search committee, but we will be informing and asking input from the congregation throughout the process. There are a lot of constraints designed to protect applicants' privacy and to avoid bad feelings and confusion among parishioners, so perfect transparency will not always be possible. The first step will be a Congregation Vitality Assessment, which consists of a survey that will go out via email to 25 congregants. This is a third-party product that the Diocese uses as step one of the transition process. The next step will be to use the data gained from the assessment to design a profile of St. Andrew's, which combined with an analysis of our financial situation will help us design an "advertisement" for potential candidates which will be disseminated nationally. The Vestry, as search committee, will evaluate candidates and proceed from there. Candidates no longer visit congregations and give guest sermons as was done in the past. The process can take anywhere from six months to a year. Julie moved that the Vestry serve as search committee with Erin Hastey to serve as chair. (current Vestry officers are not eligible for this position.) Sukey seconded. Motion passed unanimously.
- **4. Minutes for March 10 and March 30.** Erin moved and Joni seconded to approve both sets of minutes. Motion passed unanimously.
- **5. Treasurer's Report and Outreach.** Finances are running smoothly with no surprises so far.Julie moved and Sarah seconded to approve the Treasurer's Report. Motion passed unanimously.
- 6. Miscellaneous
 - a. Rev. Mary Erickson, St. John's, had requested that St. Andrew's put in a request to the Foundation to help fund the Wyoming Immigrant Advocacy Project but since St. John's is allowed to request the total amount, it was decided that St. Andrew's would not participate in funding a project that is not our own.
 - **b.** Region V Foundation Financial Discernment Road Show will be hosted by St. Andrew's on May 31st. Erin Hastey, who is the Region V representative on Diocesan Council, will keep us apprised of what we need to do to prepare.
 - c. Service Times. The service time survey was almost evenly divided between 9 am and 10 am. A participant suggested that we have summer services at 9 am and winter ones at 10 am. We will try out 10 am after the time change in the fall.

- 8. Meeting adjourned at 7:10 pm.
