St. Andrew's in the Pines Vestry Minutes August 11, 2025

- 1. Opening Prayer
- 2. **Call to Order:** 5:35 pm. Present: Sukey Hohl, Senior Warden, Sarah Hixson, Junior Warden, Joni Mack, Treasurer, Julie Belton, Clerk, Sandy Cenac and Erin Hastey.
- 3. **July Minutes:** Sarah moved to have the July Minutes accepted as presented, Erin seconded and the motion passed unanimously.
- 4. **Rectory Update:** Joni reported that a large portion of the wiring was completed last week and they expect to finish this week and start drywalling. Joni and Sukey will start on the kitchen design and paint colors soon. The kitchen cabinets will probably be the same as the ones in the Undercroft.
- 5. Treasurer's Report/Grants/Fundraising/Stewardship: We continue to be in good shape, open offering has greatly increased since we started passing the plate again and with the increased summer traffic. Joni also reported that Bob Zokotnik has had to resign from the Audit Committee due to health reasons. The new Audit Committee will be Sandy Cenac, Julie Belton and Kelley Pearson. Since our outreach funds have been steadily accumulating, we decided to make two \$1500 gifts to Episcopal Relief and Development—one to their women and children program and one to their relief efforts in Ukraine. Erin moved to make these donations. Sandy seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Julie moved to accept the Treasurer's Report and Erin seconded. The motion passed unanimously.
- 6. **Lay Leader Confirmation Letters.** Joni moved for the Vestry to sign and submit to the Diocese lay leader confirmation letters for Sarah Hixson and Sandy Cenac. The motion passed unanimously.
- 7. **Transition/Search.** Advance copies of the draft profile had been sent out to Vestry members and they brought their edits. The Vestry worked through the profile line by line catching typos, making suggestions, and discussing and reworking sections very carefully to make the document as reflective of St. Andrew's as possible. We also noted that a photographer will be at St. Andrew's on August 17th to take pictures for use in the profile. A discussion of rector pay was put off until we have more information on Diocesan requirements.
- 8. **Preparation/Refresh:** We talked about various "cleaning house" issues including a website refresh, welcome packets in the pews, serving our members at the Senior Center better, getting the logs cleaned, discussion of recent activities like S'More Church and possible new ones, and the need for a Worship Committee meeting soon to start planning for the fall and Advent services.
- 9. Miscellaneous
 - A. **Bylaws:**Bylaws discussion is put off until Kelley Pearson can attend.
 - B. **Convention** takes place on October 9-12 in Rawlins. Our delegates are Madeleine Murdock and Julia Cook. Our alternates are Erin Hastey and Julie Belton since they will be present regardless. Joni and Sukey are also going.
 - C. Bishop Visit: Bishop Ousley will be visiting us again October 4-5. There is paperwork from the Diocese that needs to be filled out. We are planning to have a church-wide meeting on Saturday where he will help us envision our future and on Sunday he will provide Holy Eucharist and hopefully, the Blessing of the Animals.
 - D. **Video:** The Diocese has requested that we submit a 15-second video thanking the Standing Committee for all their hard work. Sukey will ask the photographer, Gretchen Yost, if she will do it. It would be nice to have it outside.
 - E. Rev, Randy came by to speak to the Vestry about the Boulder Roll funds and suicide prevention. We will discuss this further later.
