**Dear Friends,**

December in America counsels consumption and revelry. Advent in the church counsels self-emptying and anticipation. December in America viewed through the lens of our faith seems off kilter and even broken. Our consumption, promoted by marketers and politicians, looks like a misappropriate response to the God-planted desire in our hearts to create space and to wait. Our revelry looks like misappropriated desire to feast at the wedding banquet hall.

What do we see in our world today? We see a marketing push from November first until the beginning of January. You will find what you seek by acquiring an object. The one with the most acquisitions, or most valuable findings, that one wins.

What do we see? We see gluttony that begins at Thanksgiving. Our revelry celebrates a false completion: feast until you can't stand up while the little match-girl stands at the window invisible. Revel in glamour, drink, extroversion, paste on a smile, dress in red with sparkles, celebrate fulfillment.

In our consuming and revelry, we are mistaking the finger pointing at the moon for the moon.

What is wrong with this picture? All our acquisitions, all our frantic consuming to meet holiday expectations, even carefully searched for items of beauty and meaning, all our acquisitions are dross. They do not provide true food for our God planted hungers. Our revelry can mistakenly communicate that the revelation of God, the consummation of God's presence, has already been fully manifested. No wonder the warm glow of alcohol diffuses into a morning headache. No wonder many feel empty, some even betrayed by the spiritual opiate that much "Christmastime" revelry brings.

Anyone can tell you, Casey especially, how much I love preparing for Christmas. I love all the fun crafts. I love the decoration of the house. I love baking until I drop. I love the search for the perfect present. I love receiving presents. I'm like a kid in a candy store. I can't get enough. I love all the giving and receiving as a symbol of showing love. Celebrating and continuing family traditions reinforces my sense of who I am and where I come from.

Consumption and Revelry – they may not be bad in themselves. December buying and feasting may have many good and Godly points to recommend them. Unfortunately, many have come to see and experience consumption and revelry as the whole of "Christmas". When we mistake the finger for the moon, celebration,

consumption and revelry, too easily turn us into John the Baptist's brood of vipers.

The antidote? If it is God's incarnation of love that has the power to save, let us focus on that! Instead of placating our desires to feast in the courts of the Lord by reveling as if those courts have been fully revealed, let us gather together for parties of anticipation. Let us make a not-yet aspect to our feasts – a waiting, a making a place, a wondering what might be called for from us in order to move toward the ultimate feast.

God loves you just as you are, today. So start there. Start with you and your family's Advent traditions. Ask how they can support your seeking for the incarnate presence of God. Ask how they can reinforce your partnering with others to work toward that final feasting. Are there ways you can make shifts in your acquisitiveness and December consumption so that your purchases aid in preparing a space? In self-emptying? Are there ways you can make shifts in your family and social commitments so they more closely reflect the anticipation of Advent rather than the consumption of Eden?

I have one thing, but only ONE thing, to add to your "Christmastime" burden. Gather your family and pray with your calendars and with your Advent and Christmas traditions. Wonder with one another how you might shift or transform those things you have already been doing and focusing on, so that places of consumption become miracles of self-emptying and places of revelry and feasting reflect the anticipation of a joy yet to be revealed.

**PROGRESS ON THE RECTORY REMODEL:** Josh Beck with Peak Building Performance has completed the exterior work, the electrical upgrade and now the flooring is complete. Both bathrooms have been completely gutted and replaced with new fixtures, tile and mirrors. Lighting is installed and most of the painting is done inside. After the Thanksgiving holiday, he will finish the interior paint and start installing cabinets, new sink and countertops in the kitchen. When all is finished, he will have it professionally cleaned and then new cellular shades will go in. New outdoor lighting will be done, too. It should all be done by the New Year. It's a cause for celebration and a big Hallelujah! A big thank you to the Foundation for the Episcopal Church in Wyoming for making this possible,

along with our Building Fund, to which many members have contributed over the years.

**St. Andrew's in the Pines Vestry Minutes**  
**October 13, 2025**

1. **Opening Prayer**
2. **Call to Order:** 5:36 pm. Present: Sukey Hohl, Senior Warden, Joni Mack, Treasurer, Erin Hastey and Kelley Pearson via Zoom.
3. **September and Special Meeting Minutes:** Kelley moved to have the September Minutes and Special Meeting minutes accepted as presented, Erin seconded and the motion passed unanimously.
4. **Buildings Update:** Joni reported that the Rectory exterior painting is completed and the interior primer is also done. Everything looks great. We have received the Diocesan Building Inspection Report. Sarah, Junior Warden, is reviewing it and will provide a task list at the November meeting. There is nothing serious in the report, just upkeep.
5. **Treasurer's Report/Grants/Fundraising:** Our finances remain steady. Joni has separated out the finances of the Rectory renovation to keep our church finances clear. We currently have \$77,060 in savings. Sukey suggested that we move the Memorial savings to general savings, since this money was originally set aside for a columbarium, which is not practical for our location. We will pay for any memorial plaques or other memorial expenses out of operating funds. Erin moved to move the Memorial Fund to savings, Kelley seconded, and motion passed unanimously. Kelley moved to accept the Treasurer's Report, Erin seconded, The motion passed unanimously.
6. **Stewardship.** Joni will be sending out pledge packets this week. Erin will speak on Stewardship November. 9, Madeleine on November 16, and Sarah on November 23. We will designate a committee to respond to ministry pledges at the next Vestry meeting.
7. **Transition/Search.** Jessica Reynolds, who was the Diocesan Transition Officer, is no longer with the Diocese and Bishop Ousley is working directly with the churches currently in transition. We were able to give him drafts of our profile, utilizing the Gretchen Yost photos, and our OTM essays during his recent visit and he promised to get back to us right after Convention.
8. **Preparation/Refresh:** Progress is being made with the pew cards, website refresh, and services at the Sublette Center. Sukey suggested we hire Gretchen Yost again to do face shots of everyone for a new photo directory and everyone agreed. She will contact Gretchen.
9. **Policy/Procedure Manual:** It was agreed to place this project on hold till the new year since our plates are already full. Sukey is keeping a list of possible subjects.
10. **Review**
  - A. **After Action:** Everyone agreed this had been a very valuable exercise.
  - B. **Audit:** Audit policies and instructions for future committees would be extremely useful.
  - C. **Bishop Visit:** Couldn't have gone better!
  - D. **Convention:** Great convention! Bishop Hunn was a great keynote speaker. Three vestry members attended.
11. **Miscellaneous**
  - A. **Upcoming Events:** Sukey referred everyone to the important dates list in the October newsletter.
  - B. **Bylaws:** It was agreed to keep to the old ones since so much change is happening right now at the Diocesan level.
  - C. Sukey mentioned that she will be out of the country on November 10 and will poll everyone to see if changing the November Vestry Meeting could take place on November 3rd instead.



## The Redemption of Scrooge

Go from “Bah, Humbug!” to a Blessed Advent and Merry Christmas. Ebenezer Scrooge is a man in dire need of a second chance. Is redemption possible for such a greedy, dark, and sad character? The Redemption of Scrooge, our coffee hour book study for this Advent, shows us how the teachings of Jesus can be found in Dickens’ Christmas classic. From the ghosts of Christmas past, to the Life of the present, and the resurrection of Christmas future, this Advent study will “bless us “every one” and reinvigorate our spiritual journeys as we look at this familiar story through the lens of faith. Join us at coffee hour every Sunday this Advent for treats and discussion.

You can pick up a copy of the book in the narthex. Prior reading is always encouraged, but never required! Each session includes a short video segment that brings us all up to speed on the key points from that week’s chapter. All ages welcome.

## RECIPE

### JOCELYN'S TROPICAL SWEET POTATO CASSEROLE

1. **GREASE** baking dish (10" x 10" x 2" or 9" x 13" or similar size)
2. **PREHEAT** oven to 350 degrees
3. **MIX** below ingredients – if it has a few lumpy spots, that's OK
  - 1 cup crushed pineapple (drained)
  - 1 1/2 cups coconut
  - 3 cups mashed /cooked sweet potato
  - 1 cup white sugar
  - 2 eggs
  - 1 tsp vanilla
  - 1/3 cup milk
  - 1/2 cup melted butter
4. **POUR** into greased baking dish
5. **TOPPING** (this is sweet without it... but what the heck)
  - 1/3 cup flour
  - 1 cup brown sugar
  - 1/3 cup butter (semi-melted)
  - 1 cup pecans (if desired)
6. **MIX** with a fork then add on top of potato mixture
7. **BAKE** for 30 to 40 minutes depending on your oven
